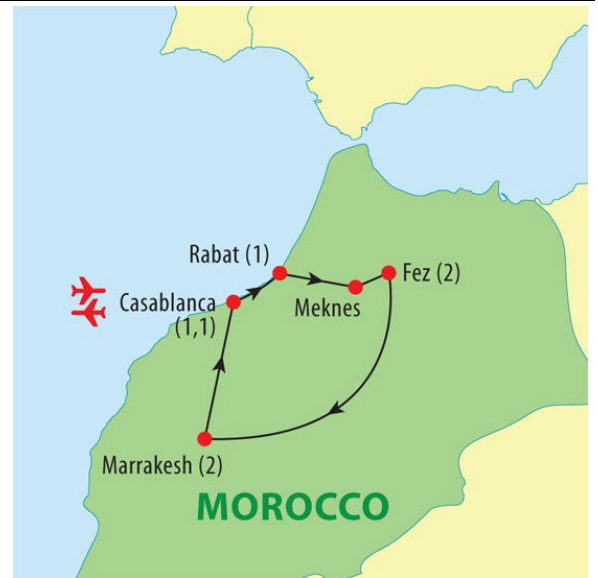


This tour visits all four Imperial cities of Morocco - Casablanca, Fez, Meknes & Rabat. At some stage throughout history all four cities have been the country's capital, Rabat being the current. Visit monuments and sights that have created history for thousands of years. Tour Casablanca, the city made famous by Humphrey Bogart's movie, buy a Fez hat in Fez or shop for some local handicrafts in Djemaa El Fna Square.



## Itinerary

### Day 1 Arrive in Casablanca

Upon arrival you are transferred from Casablanca Airport to your hotel. [D]

### Day 2 Casablanca - Rabat

Morning tour of Casablanca, the economic capital of Morocco. Your tour includes the central market, the Habous Quarter, the Royal Palace, Mohammed V Square and the Hassan II Mosque. Then travel to Rabat where your city tour includes the Royal Palace, the Mohammed V Mausoleum, the Hassan Tower and the Oudaya Kasbah. [B,D]

### Day 3 Rabat - Meknes - Fez

A morning tour of ancient Meknes which features more than 40km of city walls. Then travel via the holy city of Moulay Idriss to the fascinating Roman ruins of Volubilis before reaching Fez. [B,D]

### Day 4 Fez

A fabulous day touring the historic city of Fez, the spiritual capital of Morocco and its oldest imperial city. The day's highlight is undoubtedly the famous medina (790AD) where narrow lanes are crammed with colourful traders selling a thrilling array of goods to locals and tourists alike. Other highlights include Nejjarine Fountain, Moulay Idriss Mausoleum, Karaouine Mosque and Fez Jdid. [B,D]

### Day 5 Fez - Beni Mellal - Marrakesh

Early morning departure towards Marrakesh via the Berber villages of Immouzer du Kandjar and Ifrane. [B,D]

### Day 6 Marrakesh

Visit to historical Marrakesh, the Saadian Tombs, the Bahia Palace and the Koutoubia. After lunch at a hotel, you visit the famous Djemaa El Fna square with its surrounding souqs and handicraft quarters. [B,L]

### Day 7 Marrakesh - Casablanca

Morning at leisure before an afternoon drive back to Casablanca. [B,D]

### Day 8 Depart Casablanca

Transfer to the airport with assistance with departure formalities. [B]

## Accommodation

### **Golden Tulip Farah, Rabat**

The Golden Tulip Farah Rabat is located on the sea front and is also only 5 minutes from the city centre of Rabat. It has 2 restaurants offering International and Italian cuisine, a bar, beauty salon, fitness centre and indoor and outdoor pools. Ideally located in the centre of Rabat, this hotel is close to the Mohamed V Mausoleum, Hassan Tower, "Chellah, and Oudayas", and the Royal Gold Dar Esslam monuments.



### **Atlas Medina, Marrakech**

Although the Atlas Medina Hotel is located within the heart of Hivernage Square, it is surrounded by an amazing five hectare garden featuring 200 palm trees. The spa's rooms look out over the garden and over the two swimming pools, an outdoor pool for relaxing and an indoor pool for the more physically active. Of course there's a traditional Moroccan Hammam, and you won't want to miss a meal at the Jacaranda as Tatawi Restaurant, which offers a wonderful meal accompanied by a fine selection of Moroccan and French vintage wines.

The most popular months to travel to Morocco are between May and October. During this period the summer months of June, July and August tend to be the busiest.
